

Ultrasound Guided Kidney Biopsy

Patient Discharge Advice

You have had an Ultrasound Guided Kidney Biopsy where a biopsy needle was inserted into your Kidney to obtain a sample of tissue. You do not have any stitches to the puncture site, but there is a small dressing currently in place.

It is very important that:

- You must have someone with you who can care for you during the first 24 hours, or longer if you
 feel this is necessary, from discharge.
- You keep the puncture site clean and dry.
- When you arrive home you should rest and avoid heavy activities e.g., lifting, housework, gardening, strenuous exercise or extreme sports for at least 1 week.
- You should refrain from driving for at least 48 hours, or longer if you feel this is necessary.
- Do not have a bath (i.e., submerge the puncture site) **for 3-5 days** or until the puncture site has healed. The dressing is slightly waterproof, so a quick shower is okay.
- Pain relief (analgesia) tablets such as Paracetamol, should relieve any discomfort. Avoid **Ibuprofen** and **Aspirin** for 1 week, as these can affect your kidney function and increase the risk of bleeding.
- Avoid flying for 7 days.
- Avoid Alcohol for at least 24 hours.

Notify your GP if you experience any of the following during the first 48 hours:

- Fever
- Rash
- Persistent tenderness, redness or increasing pain at your puncture site
- Unable to pass urine
- Blood stained urine after 24 hours



You are advised to **seek urgent medical assistance as soon as possible**, either by ringing 111 or by attending the Emergency Department at either of our main hospital sites and inform them of what procedure you have had done (you may find it useful to hand them this leaflet).

Medications: Unless otherwise stated by your Doctor, you should resume your normal medications the same day. If you are on any 'blood thinning' medication such as Warfarin, Clopidogrel, Aspirin or any other then you will be informed when to re-start this.
