Valproate

A guide for people who can become pregnant

Valproate is also called:

Sodium Valproate, Epilim, Depakote, Convulex, Episenta, Epival, Kentlim, Orplet, Syonell, Valpal, Valproic Acid, Belvo and Dyzantil





What is valproate and how do you take it?



Valproate (val-pro-ate) is a medicine. Your Valproate may be a liquid, a tablet, or a granule. Take the valproate with food or just after food. Remember to take it every day.



Valproate is used for seizures (or fits).

Valproate is used for keeping your mood stable.

Valproate is used for making you feel calm.



Remember to take it every day. Do not stop taking it unless your doctor or nurse tells you to.

What are the risk to the baby?



How can I stop getting pregnant?



Contraceptives help to stop pregnancy. You must use a good contraceptive. There are different types of contraceptive such as a hormonal coil or implant



Your doctor can help you choose the best contraceptive.



You must always use a contraceptive (even if you do not have regular sex).



You might need to take a pregnancy test.

What do I need to do next?



Every year you will be contacted to have a conversation about your valproate with your doctor or nurse specialist.



You will be asked if you understand this information and sign your name if you are able to do so.



The conversation will also ask you about contraception.

You will be advised to use contraception whether you expect to get pregnant or not.



If you are not currently using contraception, please contact your doctor, specialist nurse and let them know.

Some questions you may want to ask?



What if I want to get pregnant? Or become pregnant?



What if I want to know more about valproate? What if I am worried about taking valproate? Talk to your doctor or specialist nurse.

Important information



Do not stop taking your medication talk to your doctor or specialist nurse.
