

# Financial Support for People Affected by Cancer

## Information for patients and carers

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### Introduction

This leaflet identifies some of the organisations that may be able to help you and your family cope with the unexpected cost associated with your illness.

As a cancer patient or carer you may need to reduce your working hours or give up work altogether. You may have additional temporary costs for example increased heating bills as you may be spending more time at home and of course there may be hospital parking charges.

## Benefits and Financial Guidance Services

It is important that benefits and financial guidance services are offered to you and your family at all stages of your diagnosis and treatment. You are likely to need up-to-date, good quality help and information about benefits and finances. Whatever your age, financial situation or diagnosis, you may be entitled to certain benefits, some of these are not backdated, so don't delay in seeking advice on these matters.

Not all benefits are 'means tested' and some benefits automatically qualify you for further entitlements. Even if you have a reasonable salary, a pension or savings it may be worth checking if you are entitled to anything to support you financially during this time. There are local services designed to help you make sense of financial matters at this time.

In both Calderdale and Kirklees the following services are available for you to access. They deliver advice and support for people affected by cancer and can also check whether you are entitled to any financial support or further help.

### Help with Housing and Mortgages

Your local Council may offer help with housing problems, such as council tax payments, rent issues and any other housing queries you may have.

Breathing Space offers an interest free secured loan that may help you to pay your mortgage. You will of course need to repay this loan, but it may help you when you need it most. The loan is variable and eligibility will be decided on following an application. Of course this offers short term help, but may be worth discussing. Contact your local Housing Authority Housing Options Team.

### Help with Travel Costs

Patients on certain benefits can claim back the cost of travel and parking for their hospital appointments.

Parking permits are often available for patients undergoing cancer treatments.

You may wish to consider applying for a Blue badge which will make parking easier for you when you are out and about. Your local Authority website or local Benefits Advisor will provide you with more information about how to apply for one.

### Help with Energy Costs

If you are struggling to pay energy bills, contact your energy supplier as soon as possible. You should let them know that you have cancer as they may be able to offer you support. You may also like to contact Macmillan Cancer Support on 0808 800 00 00 to ask to speak with one of their energy advisors for more information.

## Help for Carers

Carers over the age of 16 may also be able to apply for financial benefits. Your local support organisation for Carers or local Benefits Advisory Service should have information as to whether there are additional payments to which you or your main carer may be eligible.

## Employers and Financial Organisations

You may find it helpful to talk to your employer or a Union Welfare Officer. You may have paid into a health protection scheme, if you have, you may be able to have some of your costs reimbursed. Your bank, building society or mortgage provider and insurance company may be able to talk you through some of the options open to you. Planning and seeking advice early can often stop difficulties arising later.

## For Advice and Support in the Workplace:

Macmillan Cancer Support can offer help and support for patients in work, off work, returning to work and not returning to work. They can also offer help and support for individuals working whilst caring for someone with cancer.

## Prescription Charges

As a patient undergoing treatment for cancer you are eligible for free prescriptions. You can apply for an exemption certificate ( MedEx) by collecting a signed FP92A form from your GP surgery or Oncology Clinic.

The FP92A form must be signed by a GP or a hospital doctor. It is valid for 5 years and should be renewed after this time. It is a card rather than a certificate. You will need to show this to your pharmacist when you have medicines dispensed.
