Instructions on care of your casts

DO

Do keep your cast dry.

If you get your cast wet it may disintegrate and cause skin problems.

Do regularly exercise all joints that are not in cast on your injured leg/arm (e.g. fingers, toes, knee, elbow, shoulder).

Do elevate/raise your injured arm/leg when at rest. This helps reduce swelling and pain. If your leg is in cast it needs to be elevated up to chest level or above with the heel free from direct contact. (eg. not resting on any surface for long periods).

Do regularly change the resting position of the limb to minimise the risk of pressure, particularly over prominent areas.

Do telephone the plaster room if you have any problems.

- Broken, cracked or dented casts.
- Loose, tight, soft or wets casts.

Do telephone immediately if you have:

- Pins and needles, numbness or blueness (not bruising) of toes or fingers which is not relieved by elevation.
- Excessive swelling or pain.
- Soreness or rubbing under the cast.
- Any discharge or bleeding which has seeped through the cast.
- A strong smell/odour under your cast (particularly after surgery).
- If you drop anything down your cast.

Don't

Don't walk on your cast unless you have been told you can do so. If you are allowed to walk on it you will have been given a shoe and this must be on all the time except in bed.

Don't walk on your cast until it is fully dry - allow it to dry naturally.

Drying times- Plaster of Paris - 48 hours Synthetic Cast - 30 minutes

Don't sit close to a fire, your cast may become hot and burn you.

Don't wear nail polish on fingers/toes of your injured arm/leg.

Don't wear rings - fingers can swell.

Don't wear your sling for more than 24 hours if you have a cast below your elbow.

If your cast extends above your elbow you may wear a sling but remember to remove for bed and exercise.

Don't push anything down your cast.

Don't cut, remove or interfere with your cast.
