Everyone has pain at sometime but not everyone has to come into hospital because of pain.

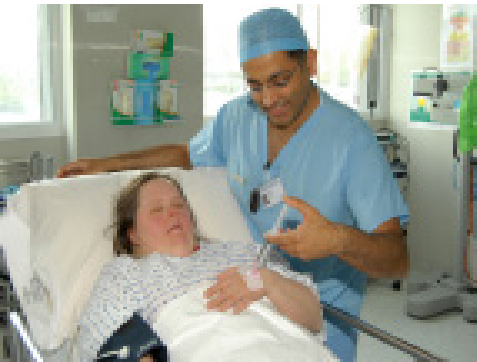


Sometimes when people are very sick they might have to come into hospital.

Why do I have pain?



It might be because you have hurt yourself or feel poorly.



Sometimes the things doctors and nurses do to try and make you better can hurt.

Things like injections or needles into the back of your hand.



You might be in pain if you have had an operation in hospital.

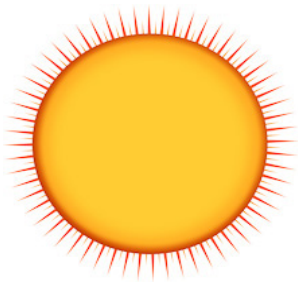


We will ask you if you can tell us what the pain feels like as this helps us find out the right kind of medicine for your pain.

It might feel like a burning pain

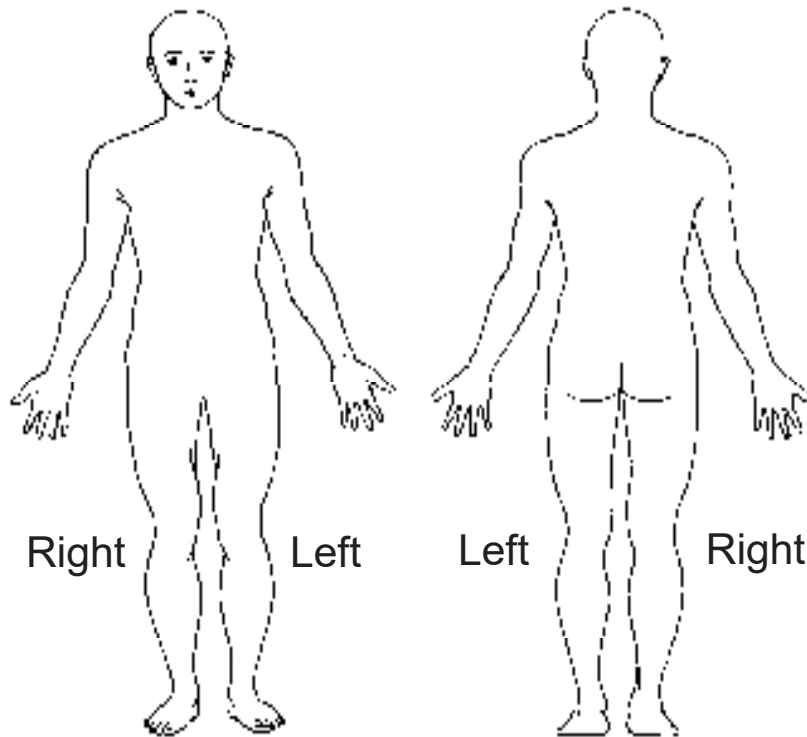


It might feel like a stabbing pain

We will ask you where your pain is.
You could use the picture to show us where it hurts.




To help us find out how bad the pain is we ask you to count out your pain using numbers.

0 is no pain at all.

10 is the worst pain ever.

What doctors and nurses can do to help your pain



They can give you some tablets

or some syrup



or an injection



or sometimes medicine from a machine



If you have an operation, you may have an injection into your back called an epidural.



You might use a machine.

Where you press a button and the medicine goes into your arm.



There are other things that help with pain.

Using a pillow to help you sit up.



Making sure you are not too warm.



or too cold.



Please ask questions if you do not understand.



Make a list of things you need to ask. If the pain does not feel better with medicine let the nurses know so they can help you.
