# Large Loop Excision of the Transformation Zone LLETZ

## Colposcopy Clinic

You have had a procedure called LLETZ (large loop excision of the transformation zone) to the cervix (neck of the womb).

This involves the removal of abnormal cells on the cervix using a loop of wire that is heated with an electrical current. This area is then treated with a ball electrode (heat) to stop any bleeding.

This treatment does not mean you have cancer but if left untreated these abnormal cells might develop into cancer in the future.

The healing process following LLETZ can differ from person to person. The cervix should heal completely within 4-6 weeks.

A vaginal discharge is usual for about 2-4 weeks and is part of the healing process.

However, should you experience heavy bleeding/clots or the discharge has an offensive smell, then you should contact us.

You may also experience some abdominal (stomach) pains after the treatment for which some pain relief may help.

We will write to you with the results of the LLETZ treatment. If you have not received a letter after 8 weeks following your procedure date then please contact us on the telephone number given.

### Do's and Don'ts following treatment

- You can have a bath or shower as normal.
- You can return to work the following day if you feel well enough
- Avoid sexual intercourse for four weeks and until the discharge stops
- Use sanitary towels not tampons for four weeks and until the discharge stops
- Light exercise may resume the following day.

- During your consultation today you may have been advised to try and give up smoking.

- We do understand that it can be very difficult to do and you may not be ready to give up
