Introduction

Epilepsy is the most common serious neurological condition affecting approximately 600,000 people in the U.K.

Epilepsy can start at any age but most commonly starts in childhood and in the elderly.

The role of the Nurse is to help, advise and support you through the maze of questions. She/he can also advise and educate friends, colleagues and employers about epilepsy and its management.

The Epilepsy Specialist Nurse can spend time with you and your family either in the clinic or at your home, to discuss any issues you may have concerning epilepsy.
